SUBJECT : <u>Supplementary Rules on Payment of</u> Traveling Expenses

Quoted hereunder for your information, guidance, and compliance is General Circular No. 88-B of the Auditor General, dated May 21, 1969, which is self-explanatory:

SUBJECT : Payment of per diems (traveling expenses) authorized under Republic Act No. 3847, as implemented by GAO General Circular No. 88-A dated August 28, 1964.

It has come to the attention of this Office that in some instances officers and employees who travel on official business outside of their permanent official station have been paid part per diems and part actual expenses for board and lodging. This practice is not mentioned by law and auditing rules and regulations.

Under Republic Act No. 3847, which was implemented by General Circular No. 88-A of this Office, dated August 28, 1964, per diems shall cover board and lodging. Significantly, one of the purposes for the enactment of said law is to streamline and simplify the payment of traveling expenses of government personnel by dispensing with the presentation of receipts to evidence payments made, thus preventing the padding of such expenses. To allow, therefore, an officer or employee to receive payment of his traveling expenses partly in the form of per diems and partly in the form of reimbursement of actual expenses would defeat the very purpose of the law. It would lack basis in law and, in fact, would be contrary thereto.

Accordingly, an officer or employee who is required to travel on official business outside of his permanent official station may claim only straight per diems to cover his board and lodging and not part per diems and part actual expenses.

Strict compliance herewith is enjoined.
