SUBJECT : Budget Circular No. 242, dated August 28, 1974

1.0 Purpose - This Circular is issued to revoke Budget Circular No. 242, dated August 28, 1974.

2.0 Rationale - To provide effective control in the disbursement of government funds, the present authority of central offices of government agencies to authorize their regional and field offices through telegrams, radiograms, etc., to draw TCAA checks without an approved Notice of Cash Disbursement Ceiling (CDC) is hereby revoked.

3.0 Effectivity - This circular shall take effect immediately.
