SUBJECT :

Contracts for Aerial Survey, Land Capability and Classification Survey and Boundary Monuments Survey.

'This Commission has noted that on several occasions, some government agencies have entered into contracts with private contractors for Aerial Survey, Land Capability and Classification Survey and Boundary Monuments Survey notwithstanding the fact that other government agencies like the Bureau of Coast and Geodetic Survey, the Philippine Army and the Philippine Air Force, Bureau of Lands and the Ministry of Agrarian Reform, have either undertaken or caused to have the different surveys of the various parts of the country or could do the job subject of the various contracts.

To avoid unnecessary expenditures of government funds and duplEcation of work, all concerned are cautioned that before entering into a contract for Aerial Survey, Land Capability and Classification Survey, Boundary Monuments Survey, and the like, they should first verify, if any such survey of the region in question had been undertaken by the above-named agencies or whether said government agencies could undertake the job. A certification from such government agencies to the effect that no such survey of the region in question has been undertaken and/or that they cannot undertake the job should be attached to every contract for surveys entered into by government agencies with any private contractor.

All concerned should be guided accordingly.
