MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR

SUBJECT : Guidelines on the Reporting of Typhoon Damages and Implementation of Repairs/Restoration Works

In furtherance of the Agency's objective for a more effective and expeditious restoration of typhoon damages to existing irrigation and related facilities as well as on-going projects, hereunder are the guidelines in preparing reports of typhoon damages, program of work and other related activities:

 Typhoon damages should be reported by the Regional/ Project Manager to the Administrator, Att'n: The Chairman, Task Force on Typhoon Damages (TFTD), CORPLAN, within 48 hours after the event following the format in the attached Report Form No. TD-01, thru Radiogram, Facsimile or telegram.

Said report will be the basis of the management in immediately informing the national government on the extent of typhoon damages on irrigation facilities.

- The RIOs shall conduct on-site inspections and assessments of reported damages and shall be responsible in the preparation of the Program of Work. The TETP may conduct field inspections and verifications on a selective basis.
- 3. The Program of Work for the repair and restoration activities shall be prepared in accordance with the a requirements of standard program of work and submitted to the Administrator Attention: The Chairman, Task Force on Typhoon Damages, for evaluation and preparation of requests for suballotment advises (SAA) by respective departments, namely, SMD, CIDD or CMD.
- 4. The estimated cost of damages/restoration shall be classified into two categories, namely: (a) cost of immediate remedial measures (Level I) to save standing crops, and (b) cost of restoration works (Level II).

For monitoring purposes, the following information are also required: (a) cropped area affected by the typhoon in hectares, (b) cost of damages on crops, (c) number of affected farmers and (d) photographs of damages.

- 5. The Central Office shall provide in the yearly budget an amount of P50 million as repair and stabilization fund that can be released to affected areas for the immediate/emergency repairs or remedial measures while requests for funding from the national government are being sought.
- 6. The TFTD shall be responsible in identifying sources of funds to support the requirements of restoring irrigation and related facilities damaged by typhoons.
- 7. The SMD, CIDD, CMD and RIO Managers shall be responsible monitoring, evaluation and in accomplishment reports and consolidation of in apprising the management of the periodic status of ongoing repair/restoration activities of damaged irrigation and related facilities.
- 8. Involvement of Irrigators Associations or any farmersgroup in the restoration/construction works should be explored by the field offices to facilitate the repair of damaged facilities.
- 9. Field offices should organize their local Task Forces in order to make an immediate and coordinated response to any eventuality of typhoons/flash floods affecting the delivery of irrigation service.
- 10. The Regional/Project Manager should coordinate with the Regional Disaster Coordinating Council in the area and inform top management, through the TFTD, of any actions made or required as a result of this coordination.
- 11. The TFTD may call on any Manager or staff of the Agency who can assist the group in its activities.

This supersedes previous issuances/circulars dealing on typhoon/flash flood damages which are inconsistent herewith.
