## SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR MONETIZATION OF ACCUMULATED LEAVE CREDITS

SUBJECT	:	<b>Request for Monetization of Accumulated Leave Credits</b>

Sec. 23, Rule XVI of the Omnibus Rules on Leave (CSC MC No. 41, S. 1998) was amended to squarely address the need to provide for the allowance of the monetization of 50% or more of accumulated leave credits in consideration of an employee's dire financial needs subject to availability of funds. Said amendment was circularized under NIA MC No. 58, s. 2002.

However, considering the number of employees who are requesting for monetization of their accumulated leave credits, there is a need to set a ceiling on the total amount to be monetized per employee in order for the Agency to accommodate the requests of as many employees as possible.

In view of the foregoing, it is respectfully recommended that requests for monetization of leave credits shall not exceed P100,000.00 per employee subject to availability of funds. For regional/field offices which are paying the request for monetization that does not require cash from NIA-C.O., compliance to the foregoing ceiling on monetization is left to the sound discretion of concerned officials.
